
how to use stems

1. hello stems

Copy the stems from iTunes and import them into your favorite music editing software.


You'll notice that each stem is the same length as the Original Mix track. We've done this so you can understand the structure of the original song. From here, you can cut up the track to taste, add effects, more instruments, etc.

Different programs treat audio clips differently. As long as the application supports AAC files, the stems should import correctly.




2. remix it


Cut, paste, edit, bounce.



If you're new to music production, we recommend using Apple Garage Band (Mac only) and Fruity Loops or similar on Windows PC.

If you are a more advanced user, you can use Ableton Live, Logic, Cubase, or another application. Free trials are available online. Visit our website www.subdrive.net for more information.





3. submit it


Once you've completed your remix, submit it to blogs and to us.
